## The E-Infrastructure Board (EIB)

- Mandate: "... to design, create and operate an evolving, efficient and functional e-infrastructure environment at a reasonable cost for the collaboration. Initially the focus will be the development of a Computing Model for the ET."
  - Prepare a plan of the studies and activities that need to be undertaken for the development of the ET computing
  - Propose a computing model and its updates to the collaboration
- The EIB is chaired by Stefano Bagnasco and Patrice Verdier

#### EIB open task list

- EIB is actively searching for additional person-power; many important activities are uncovered
- ullet The different divisions have recently prepared + presented lists of short-term open tasks
- The compiled list will be presented at next week's CB meeting, as a call for RU involvement

# Div1: software, frameworks, and MDC support [Andres Tanasijczuk]

## Support for the first Mock Data Challenge (MDC)

- Input data distribution
  - Use Open Science Data Federation (previously known as StashCache) infrastructure
     CVMFS tools from OSG (same as LVK)
  - Installed ET-dedicated OSDF Origin server in UCLouvain to host the data
  - Close contact with OSB Div10 to produce the data and transfer them to Louvain server
  - Data starting to appear in CVMFS: /cvmfs/et-gw.osgstorage.org/et-gw/PUBLIC/MDC1/
    - Data are publicly accessible
  - Documentation for users on how to access the data will soon be added to a wiki
    - Instructions will also be provided on how to access the data without CVMFS
- Computing resources ?
  - Not yet clear whether any resources need to be provided for the first MDC
  - In case of need, some resources have been secured at INFN-CNAF

## Other division activities

- Div2: services and collaboration support [Antonella Bozzi]
  - So far, main focus was the successful deployment of the ET member database (ETMD)
  - Now evaluating proposals for identity and access management (IAM)
    - IAM defines who has access to specific resources/data/etc
- Div3: computing and data model, resource estimation [Gonzalo Merino]
  - Key to planning the future of the ET EIB; lots of cross-talk with ET-PP (next slide)
  - Work is starting on evaluation of the resource requirements for ET
- Div4: multimessenger alerts and low-latency infrastructure [Steven Schramm]
  - Division activities so far have focused on establishing our role within international networks
    - Recent efforts include INFRA-TECH (M2Tech), INFRA-SERV (ACME), and other consortia
  - Plan to start more concrete activities (evaluating infrastructure, etc) soon
- TTWG: Technology tracking working group [Sara Vallero]
  - Transversal effort to ensure the EIB keeps up-to-date on latest technological advances
  - Planning to organise ~monthly seminars, inviting key external experts to present

### Other EIB activities

- ET Preparatory Phase INFRA-DEV (ET-PP)
  - ET-PP WP8 focuses on computing, led by Achim Stahl + Sergi Girona + Nadia Tonello
    - Hired a new system engineer: Alba Gonzalvez, at the Barcelona Supercomputing Centre
    - Hiring process for a second position, at the University of Geneva, is concluding
  - Close cooperation with the EIB, especially on resource estimation (Div3)
  - Work towards the first deliverable, requirements for computing + data model, has begun

- Product Breakdown Structure (PBS)
  - Work is ongoing, led by Patrice Verdier, towards establishing the EIB PBS
  - Had PBS in mind when designing EIB: expect PBS to generally map to division structure
  - A couple of proposals are being prepared for next week's PBS meeting
