ET Collaboration (ETC)





The ET-BGR Scope and purpose (from ToR):

- 1. The ET BGR, is established as **strategic forum** to discuss and agree in consultation with the ET coordinators on the progress and process of realizing ET. The BGR can invite the coordinators to a meeting.
- 2. The ET BGR shall among others prepare, discuss, negotiate, and approve the documents needed for the setting up of the ET legal entity.
- 3. ET BGR will especially aim to reach consensus on:
- the procedure to select the host country for the ET, including what kind of information will be needed for the selection procedure;
- the legal model, governance structure and founding documents;
- the financial plan and the draft internal financial rules;
- policy papers;
- the **procedure for selection and appointment of the Interim Executive Director** when needed;
- any other issues deemed necessary by the ET BGR and its members.

The ET BGR and its rules are valid until they are replaced by other rules, or until the ET BGR terminates and any other interim or final ET governance boards, under the approved ET legal model, are set up.



The ET-BGR has established a Site Selection Criteria Working Group

Section 1: Scope and purpose

- 1. The Working Group on Site Selection Criteria, hereafter referred to as the 'WG', is established as an advisory body to the Board of Governmental Representatives for the ET, hereafter referred to as the 'BGR'.
- 2. The WG shall provide a draft execution plan to the BGR on the site selection procedure for the ET that ensure its fairness and transparency. This will include:
 - the identification and the definition of the criteria to take into account,
 - their respective weighting,
 - · the decision procedure,
 - timeframe and intermediate steps.


